

## Action Plan

In a classroom that gives students the responsibility to make decisions, a plan must be put in place to help us know what to do if we make the wrong choice. Being responsible for our own behavior can sometimes create problems, if we are not used to the freedom we are being given. This means that students must assume the responsibility for some of the problems they encounter, as well as assume the responsibility to help one another when a problem does arise. Create an action plan that you and your classmates can use to solve a problem you are facing in class.



Example of an Action Plan:

### What is the problem?

I have not been completing my homework because I keep leaving the books I need in school.

### Why is this a problem?

When I don't do the assignments, I get confused in class. I also can't help my group because I don't understand what they are working on.

### What steps can I take to solve this problem?

1. I need to write down my assignments in a homework notebook.
2. I need to stop working 5 minutes before the bell and pack all of the books I will need.
3. I need to have a buddy check to make sure I have everything I will need.
