

The Power of Poetry Club Facilitation Questions

<p>Comprehension</p> <p><i>Ask questions which ensure students understand the content and the skills needed to solve the problem</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What do you need to accomplish this task? • What is your favorite poem? Why?
<p>Application</p> <p><i>Ask questions which ensure the ability of students to apply learning to new situations</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How will your group show what gives poetry power? • How will you organize your thoughts to create a poem? • Do you see any patterns in poems that are effective?
<p>Connection</p> <p><i>Ask questions which ensure the ability of students to apply learning to their lives</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How can you apply what you've learned about poetry in your original poem? • Do you think you can be a poet like Jack Prelutsky?
<p>Synthesis</p> <p><i>Ask questions which encourage students to create new information from existing data</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How will you use your research to address potential objections to personal position? • How does the history of capital punishment affect how the death penalty is used in each state?
<p>Metacognition</p> <p><i>Ask questions which prompt students to think about their own thinking processes</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What was the hardest part of this task for you? • How might you go about solving the task differently? • What problems did you encounter while working on this task and how did you solve them?
